### What is Adopt-a-Stream?

The goal of the Rivers Unlimited (RU)

Adopt-a-Stream program is to empower citizens to become actively involved in protecting their waterways through river clean-ups, as well as through training and educational opportunities.

Adopt-a-Stream is a new program that will be piloted on the Great Miami River from the City of Hamilton, Ohio, to its confluence with the Ohio River. This 35 mile stretch of the river will be divided into 1-2 mile "adoptable" segments.

Stream Stewards are individuals or groups who adopt segments of the Great Miami River. Stream Stewards will commit to cleaning up their adopted segments three times per year. Cleanup dates are chosen by Stream Stewards and can be done on foot and/or by canoe.

Rivers Unlimited will assist Stream Stewards with their clean-up efforts by providing materials and assistance with trash removal. Adopters will be identified on signs along the river, and will have the opportunity to attend Rivers Unlimited's Watershed Institute this fall.

#### How Does it Work?

- Interested Stream Stewards can contact Rivers Unlimited at <u>info@riversunlimited.org</u>, or at 513.761.4003 to identify a segment.
- Once a segment is identified, Stream
   Stewards should designate a Site Coordinator, a point person who can receive materials and correspondence from Rivers Unlimited.
- All volunteers and Site Coordinators must complete and submit the Stream Steward Application and the Liability Release to RU before any clean-up events are conducted.
- Site Coordinators will notify RU in advance of their intended clean-up day to ensure they receive necessary assistance and materials. A list of materials is provided in the next column.
- Adopt-a-Stream volunteers will conduct one clean-up each spring (Mar-Apr-May), summer (June-July-Aug), and fall (Sept-Oct-Nov).
- Within two weeks of each clean-up, volunteers will submit a Clean-up Report, along with photographs of their event.

# What is Provided by Rivers Unlimited?

- Maps, directions, and access points to clean-up sites.
- A Stream Steward Guide that includes important information about your clean-up and a safety checklist.
- For river segments accessible only through private property, RU will secure permission from the landowner(s).
- Gloves and trash bags.
- Access to canoes if needed. Volunteers are encouraged to use their own canoes and kayaks, if possible.
- Trash disposal, if needed.
- Commemorative signs recognizing Stream Stewards at bridges and other access points along the Great Miami River.
- FREE registration at RU's Watershed Institute, which will provide hands-on training for volunteers to become more actively involved in preventing pollution and monitoring water quality in their watershed.
